Quick Reference Guide: Narrator for Windows 10 Keys & Touch Commands

Recommended browser: Microsoft Edge

Getting Started

Narrator key: By default, either Caps Lock or Insert can be used as the Narrator key. This guide refers to it as Caps Lock.

Narrator Views: Narrator has several navigation settings, called views. View types include items (default), characters, words, lines, paragraphs, headings, links, tables, and landmarks. Change view type using Caps Lock + Page Up or Caps Lock + Page Down (or Caps Lock + Control + Up Arrow or Caps Lock + Control + Down Arrow).

Scan mode: Scan mode allows quick navigation of a web page or application and enables specific keystrokes to navigate by elements such as headings, links, and landmarks. It also includes keystrokes for table navigation. Activate scan mode using Caps Lock + Space Bar.

Developer mode: Developer mode masks the screen, highlighting only the objects and text exposed programmatically to Narrator. This offers a visual representation of the accessibility of the information on the screen and what is exposed to Narrator through UI Automation.

^{**}Although using this gesture will act similarly to the keyboard command to "Start reading continuously from this point on," the difference is that when you use this gesture and then use the keyboard command or gesture to "Stop reading," the focus remains where the reading began, instead of moving to where the reading was stopped.
